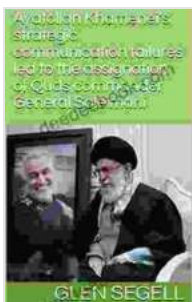


Ayatollah Khamenei's Strategic Communication Failures Led to the Assassination of Qassem Soleimani

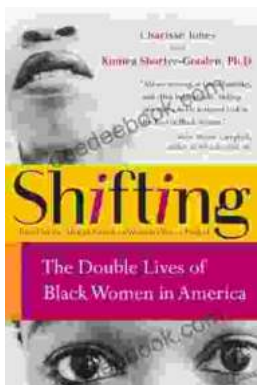

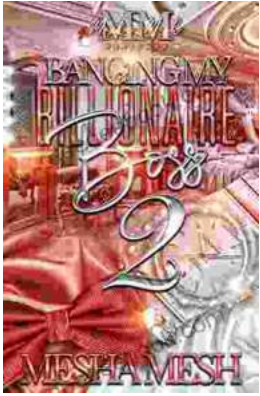
