## Materials

- Seed beads (size 6/0 or 8/0) in your desired colors
- Cross pendant (available at craft stores or online)

- Beading wire (24-26 gauge)
- Beading needle
- Scissors
- Crimp beads (optional)
- Jump rings (optional)

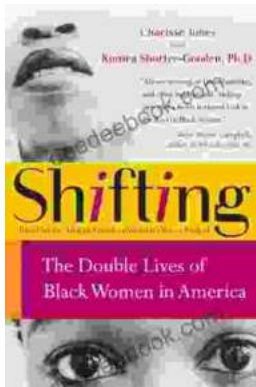


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
