### **Guest Appearances: Doctor Who Crosses Over**

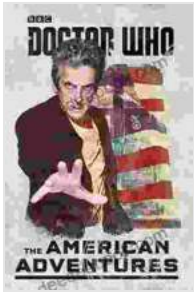

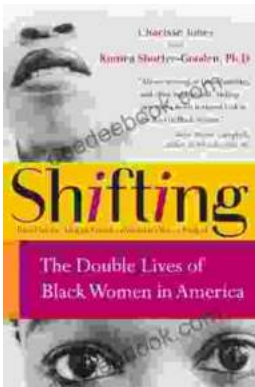
