

Mozart Sonata for Two Pianos in D Major, K. 448 (375a): Complete Sheet Music Score

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart composed the Sonata for Two Pianos in D Major, K. 448 (375a) in 1781, during his stay in Vienna. At the time, Mozart was at the height of his career, and he had already composed some of his most famous works, including the Piano Concerto No. 21 in C Major, K. 467, and the Violin Concerto No. 5 in A Major, K. 219.

The Sonata for Two Pianos was written for Mozart's students, the daughters of Count Franz von Walsegg. Walsegg was a wealthy patron of the arts, and he commissioned Mozart to write a number of works for his family. The sonata was first performed by Mozart and his sister, Maria Anna, at a concert in Vienna on April 14, 1781.

The first movement is in sonata form and begins with a lively and energetic theme in D major. The second theme is in A major and is more lyrical and expressive. The development section of the movement is based on the first theme and includes some dramatic modulations. The movement concludes with a recapitulation of the first and second themes.

The second movement is in ABA form and features a beautiful and flowing melody in F major. The B section is in D minor and provides a contrasting mood to the A section. The movement concludes with a return to the A section.

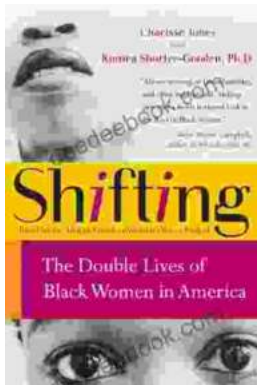

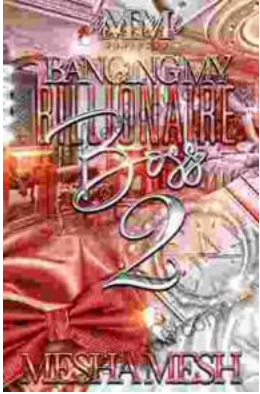
